Warehouse Work



SAFETY TIPS

With summer months really kicking into gear, ensure you are keeping sun safety a priority...also ensure you are drinking plenty of water to keep up your hydration.



DID YOU KNOW?

Sun exposure is the cause of about 99% of non-melanoma skin cancers and 95% of melanoma in Australia⁵. A very small number of skin cancers are due to genetic predisposition. Both melanoma and non-melanoma skin cancers can appear anywhere on the body, not just sun exposed areas.

- ◆ Sunburn
- ◆ Solar keratoses and premature ageing of the skin
- ◆ Eye damage

In order to ensure your exposure is reduced wear sunscreen provided, wear long sleeve shirts under your high vis, wear safety sunglasses, wear the hard hat neck shade / halo / visors (you can request these directly from the Bluewater Head Office)

Check out this information from the Cancer Council Australia:

Australia has the highest rate of skin cancer in the world. Despite being an almost entirely preventable disease, it continues to affect two in every three Australians before the age of 70. Of all new cancers diagnosed in Australia each year, 80% are skin cancers.

The workplace is a major source of exposure for many adult Australians. It is not surprising that outdoor workers who are required to spend long periods of time working in the sun, year after year, have a higher than average risk of skin cancer.

What are some of the harmful effects of solar UV radiation?

MYTH

10 myths about sun protection:

- ◆ Sun damage is no possible on windy, cloudy, or cool days – FALSE
- ◆ A fake tan darkens the skin, protecting skin from the sun – FALSE
- ◆ Sunscreen is not necessary when using cosmetics with SPF – FALSE
- ◆ People with olive skin are not at risk of skin cancer – FALSE
- ◆ You can stay out longer in the sun when you are wearing SPF50+ than you can with SPF30+ - FALSE
- ◆ Plenty of sun exposure is required to avoid vitamin D deficiency – FALSE
- ◆ You don't have to be concerned about skin cancer because if it happens you will see it, and it's easy to treat – FALSE
- ◆ Only sun seekers get skin cancer – FALSE
- ◆ If you tan but don't burn, you don't need to bother with sun protection – FALSE
- ◆ You can't get burnt in the car through a window - FALSE

Your safety is our #1 priority, but you also have to remember to SLIP, SLOP, SLAP, SEEK, SLIDE often
